The City of Opole

Opole is a vibrant city in southwest Poland. As the capital of the smallest voivodeship (province) of Poland, Opole has the largest ratio of students to citizens in the whole of the country, a fact that truly makes it an academic centre with a unique atmosphere – you can find student culture and entertainment everywhere. Along with the calm and captivating character of the city, verdant surroundings, and a successful mixture of old and modern architecture, Opole offers space for both fun and reflection.

In comparison to other university towns, cities, and metropolises, where the cost of living and transportation are often high, Opole is considerably less expensive. This is not solely due to low prices for goods, but also the fact that everything of interest is usually within walking distance, and even closer if you make use of the publicly available bikes. But then again, places of interest are not the only local. Opole is conveniently situated between the bigger cities of Wroclaw, with its international atmosphere, industrial Katowice, and the traditionally Catholic Czestochowa.

Our city has a prestigious reputation as being the "Capital of Polish Song" – where the National Festival of Polish Song is held annually at the Opole Amphitheatre, along with the Opole Confrontation Theatre, organized by Jan Kochanowski Theatre. For those seeking refuge from everyday life, Opole offers relaxing afternoons in the enchanting park on Bolko Island, which boasts one of the most beautiful zoos in Poland, and walks on the boulevards along the Młynówka Canal, which is an integral part of the so-called "Venetian Opole." Faculty of Economics

The Faculty of Economics employs a highly-qualified staff of academics who have taught and conducted research in a variety of economic fields of expertise for years. Faculty of Theology

The Faculty of Theology is in the top twenty five faculties at Polish universities. We educate new priests, catechists, social workers, musicologists, and cultural scholars. Our students may also focus on religious art and music. The faculty closely cooperates with many academic institutions in Europe and the USA, and is a prominent member of the International Federation of Catholic Universities.

The faculty offers both secular and clerical studies within Bachelor's and Master's Programs in Theology; Family Studies; Musicology; and Mediterranean Culture. We offer doctoral (Ph.D.) studies in Theology, as well.

The Faculty of Natural and Technical Sciences teaches our students everything that they need to know about the following subjects: natural and environmental science, paleobiology, genetics, and bioinformatics. The faculty's involvement has been crucial in establishing an academic oversight for the paleontological site in Krasiejów, whose famous Dinopark now compliments the area where unique fossils of Triassic dinosaurs have been excavated. Research conducted at the faculty includes environmental engineering, landscape architecture, and even digital image processing engineering.

The faculty offers Bachelor's and Master's Programs and several specializations within the subjects of Landscape Architecture, Biology, Biotechnology, Technical and Information Education, Environmental Engineering, Environmental Protection, Nature Studies, and Renewable Energy Sources. The latter is the newest program at our faculty and we are excited to offer it to you. We offer doctoral (Ph.D.) studies in Biology.

We have considerable experience in what we teach, especially as our environmental protection program is the oldest one in the country. Faculty of History and Pedagogy

We offer doctoral (Ph.D.) studies in History, Pedagogy, Philosophy, and Political Sciences.

All of our Institutes are very welcoming to foreign students and we try our best to make them feel at home. Each Institute has something unique that makes it a perfect choice for you, if you intend to study with us.

We are proud of the activities and projects of our units. For example, the Institute of History is the only one in Poland where you can study Biography Studies, and it also organizes studies at international archaeological sites. Our highly-qualified staff of professors, habilitated doctors, doctors, and assistants bring our students to the heights of philological knowledge, making our faculty one of the best in the whole country.

The faculty offers studies in English, German, Romance, East Slavic, and Polish languages, matching them with the appropriate Culture Studies of the chosen languages and their respective countries. Faculty of Chemistry:

The study of Chemistry at Opole University (formerly the Opole Higher Pedagogical School) has taken place since 1964, as a part of Faculty of Mathematics Physics and Chemistry. In 2008 the Faculty of Chemistry was established. It is now located in one of the most recently renovated buildings at our University. Our laboratories are equipped with the newest instruments, allowing us to match international standards of quality and comfort in studying chemistry, for example by providing our students with access to specialized laboratories.

The Faculty of Chemistry offers Bachelor's and Master's Programs in Biological Chemistry, Cosmetic Chemistry, New Materials Chemistry, and New Polymeric Materials Chemistry. We offer doctoral (Ph.D.) studies in Chemistry, as well.

Our faculty acknowledges the fact that a modern scientist needs to know foreign languages and that is why our students attend an obligatory course in Chemistry English. Our MSc and Ph.D. seminars are taught in English, and the literature we use is also primarily in this language. We regularly invite foreign lecturers and teachers to visit us and we encourage our students to participate in a variety of exchange programs.

We are incredibly proud of our state-of-the-art equipment, which is available to our entire staff and students alike. We are aware that reliable research results and experiments depend on the newest technology available, and we provide them with gas and liquid chromatographs featuring various types of detectors, capillary electrophoresis instruments, NMR, FTIR, NIR, UVVis, Mass spectrometers, Xenotest, and others. Our students often participate in projects and grants funded by the Polish Government and the EU, and do research for companies.

The Faculty of Mathematics, Physics and Computer Science offers studies for students that have a wide range of plans for the future – from IT to finance, from insurance companies and even medicine. The definite advantage of the faculty is its highly-qualified staff of experts and constantly developing and modernized technical base, including the faculty's own astronomical observatory.

The faculty offers Bachelor's and Master's Programs and several specializations within the subjects of Mathematics, Physics, and Information Technology, the latter being available in the Engineering Degree Program, as well. We offer doctoral (Ph.D.) studies in Physics and Mathematics.

There are several courses held in English within the scope of CICSO, Microsoft ITA, and RedHat academies. Individual consultations in English are possible. Skills acquired during those academies can be tested or practiced in two complete net labs for 16 people, which are based on CISCO devices. We also use LEGO Mindstorms sets in teaching.

Our students actively participate in the meetings of Student Science Groups that deal with the issues of the three disciplines mentioned. Young physicists visit schools and make fascinating natural science presentations. Those students who need to are also able to use two virtualization servers, provided by our faculty for individual and group projects.

Studying at our University

Those interested in studying at Opole University may do so by contacting their university's International Office and applying for the ERASMUS Programme.

There are several procedures you need to follow, so we'll provide you with this short guide that may also serve as a reminder.

What to do before arriving at Opole University

FIRST: Let us get to know you!

Send an application form to the International Office at Opole University. You can find it (and additional information) on our website: www.erasmus.uni.opole.pl

Please remember that you have to fill it out on your computer. You must also enclose other required documents, such as the Learning Agreement, and send all of the documents via normal post to:

The application deadlines at Opole University are:

- June 15 for Fall semesters;
- December 15 for Spring semesters.

Once the Erasmus Coordinator accepts your application, you will be sent a Letter of Acceptance, which might be required if you also apply for a visa.

SECOND: Find yourself a place to live!

You might want to find a flat in advance, but the easiest way is to apply for accommodation at one of our dormitories. Once again, the application form can be found on our website and the deadlines are exactly the same.



THIRD: Make sure you have insurance!

If you are an EU/EEA citizen you need to apply for the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC), which – in case of illness or accident – you need to show to your doctor along with an ID card, passport, etc. This will provide you with free health care in our country.

If you come from a country that is not a member of EU/EEA, you need to purchase heath insurance before departure. Unfortunately, you will have to pay for medical consultation, but the costs will be paid back by your health insurance company afterwards.

FOURTH: Complete the official paperwork!

Members of the EU/EEA have it a bit easier at start. You just need a valid passport (or ID) card to enter and reside in Poland for up to three months. If you need to stay longer than that, you need to apply for a Temporary Residence Permit at the Regional Office in Opole. Don't worry, we will help you with that!

Non-EU/EA citizens have a bit more paperwork to do before they arrive in Poland. Why? Because you will probably need a visa (it depends on your country, so you have to check beforehand). Short-term visas allow to stay in Poland for up to three months, long-term visas – up to a year. Make sure you apply for the right one. Students who received their visa do not need to apply for temporary residence as described in the previous paragraph.





What to do upon arrival at Opole University?

FIRST: Check in!

When you arrive in Opole, find your way to the dormitory assigned to you and check in, so that you can leave your luggage in your room.

Very often our students offer to help foreign students with their first steps, but you have to contact them yourself at: **buddy.uo@gmail.com**. You can even arrange that they will meet you at the station!

SECOND: Let us know you are here!

Come to our office and tell us you have arrived. It is common practice nowadays that you will need our confirmation of your arrival slip sent to your home university.

THIRD: Agree to the Learning Agreement!

Contact the corresponding Faculty Coordinator at Opole University and determine the final details of your study program. If there are any changes to what you expected to study here, make sure you consult them and let your home university know.

FOURTH: Have a bit of fun with us!

Attend our meetings and participate in the activities we have prepared for you as a part of the Orientation Week. We will show you around our University and its vicinity, tell you a bit about Poland, and answer all of your questions.

FIFTH: Pick up some of the language!

Ask about our free Polish Language courses. They take two months to complete and they introduce you to the very basics of Polish language, which might prove helpful in everyday situations.



FIRST: Receive your credits!

After you take all of your exams, contact your Coordinator and ask them for your Transcript of Records. It contains all of the credits for the courses you have taken.

SECOND: Visit... everyone!

You will also receive something called the "Karta Obiegowa" – a clearance slip that has to be signed by the majority of our offices, such as the library, your dormitory, and the dean's office (where you will have to leave your student ID). It will confirm that you have no formal dues at Opole University and can officially leave.

THIRD: Give those to us!

When you have both of the documents completed, make a copy of each and bring it to our International Relations Office. When you give them to us, we will give you a Confirmation of Study Period slip – a document that confirms that you have studied at our University. You will need it when you get back to your home university.





Living in Opole

Accommodation at Opole University

Those who apply for accommodation at our campus will be assigned to either the "Niechcic" or "Kmicic" dormitories. Both offer double or triple rooms (no singles, sorry!) with a shared bathroom and kitchen. The approximate price is 350 złotys (about 85 euro) per month, including rent, utilities, internet, etc.

All rooms are furnished with everything for a comfortable stay, including internet access and cable TV. You will not be able to use Wi-Fi before you get your student ID (it may take up to 3 weeks), so remember to bring your own Ethernet cable!

There is a fridge and an oven in the kitchen, so you can prepare your own food. The bathroom has a shower, and washing machines are in a separate room on each floor. The dormitory does not provide irons or hair dryers. You need to bring them yourself or buy them here.

Unfortunately, the dormitory does not have a canteen that serves meals. You need to buy your own food, which you can keep and prepare in the kitchen in your room.
